



The Community and Impact of Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCUs)

- HBCUs represent just 3% of all higher education institutions in the United States—there are 101 HBCUs, both public and private—but educate twice as many Pell-eligible students as non-HBCUs.
- HBCUs graduate 20% of all Black higher education graduates, or 325,000 annually.
- *HBCUs have graduated*:
 - **40%** of all Black engineers;
 - 40% of all Black US Congress members;
 - **50%** of all Black lawyers; and **80%** of all Black judges.
- HBCUs also supply more Black applicants to medical schools than non-HBCU institutions.
- Delaware State University is among the best drivers of socio-economic mobility in the U.S.



Highlights

- The **No. 1 choice** for students of color in Delaware.
- Inspire Scholarship captured **75%** of all new, full-time in-state first-year students.
- **41%** increase in our physical footprint with Wesley acquisition and opening of DSU Riverfront.
- Achieved R2 Research Status DSU's research portfolio has grown from \$18M to \$45M.
- 25% enrollment growth since 2020.
- **71%** of students are Pell grant eligible.
- 70% of students graduate with work-based learning.
- **91%** of faculty now have terminal degrees.
- Early College School expansion now serves 583 students.
- Two new academic buildings in the construction phase **ECIC to open May 2025**.





U.S. Higher Education Trend: HBCUs Critical to Closing Racial Wealth Gap


HBCU graduates represent:

ROI for HBCUs is not just financial. On every indicator of well-being, black students attending HBCUs fare better than similarly situated students at Predominantly White Institutions (PWIs). In addition to educating talented people of color and enabling a mobility rate twice that of our peers, we also make better, more confident global citizens who are committed to finding professional success and giving back to their community.




DSU's level of state funding falls far behind other public HBCUs.




