The **Global Eagle Award** is presented to state correctional agencies with ACA accreditation across all facilities

The Lucy Webb Hayes Award recognizes state correctional agencies that have achieved full ACA accreditation along with full compliance with the Prison Rape Elimination Act

The Department of Correction earns national recognition



DOC PRIORITY: Safety and Security

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Equipment – Implemented Body Worn Cameras for P&P Officers, purchased Tasers, contraband detection scanners, security cameras and radio equipment, new statewide 700 MHz radio system

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Infrastructure and Deferred Maintenance Projects – Continue to prioritize securing funding to maintain reliable infrastructure and climate control systems

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Aging and Disabled Populations – Full-time ADA Compliance Officer position established; focus on modifying housing units to enhance accessibility standards and ADA compliance



DOC PRIORITY: <u>Recruitment & Retention</u>

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Employee Compensation - Increased salaries, sign-on bonuses and cadet lodging program

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Staff Training and Wellness - Leadership and EPICS training, cross-training, and acknowledging stress and trauma

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Recruitment Initiatives – Paid advertising, increased social media outreach, more hiring events, updating job posting and promotional standards, choice of facility assignment



DOC PRIORITY: Rehabilitation & Reentry

Treatment:

Specialized housing, range of treatment based on clinical assessment

- SUD treatment (Road 2 Recovery) and behavioral health treatment based on national evidence-based models.

Cognitive interventions:

Cognitive behavioral interventions based on evidence-based assessments

- Criminogenic thinking: Thinking for a Change, Transitions, Thinking Things Through
- Self-Improvement and Management: Anger Management, Commitment to Change
- Social and Interpersonal Skills: InsideOut Dad, Parenting, Project New Start, Alternative to Violence

Work Experience/Facility jobs:

- Employee Peer Support workers (Peer Support Certification with Mental Health Association in Delaware) and Patient Companion workers (Home Health Aid certification with Delaware Tech)
- Wide variety of prison jobs including unskilled and skilled (food service workers receive ServSafe® Certification)

Education/Life Skills:

- Partnership with DOE to provide full range of Adult Basic Education (ABE) classes, GED (including Fast Track GED), Groves High School Diploma
- Launched Associates Degree Program in Level V facilities (Second Chance Pell with Delaware Tech)
- Customer Service training (industry recognized customer service certification through Tech Impact)



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DOC PRIORITY: Rehabilitation & Reentry (continued)

Vocational Training

- Created Commercial Driver's License Vocational Program
- Established entry-level **construction training** (NCCER certification)
- Launched welding pre-apprenticeship
- Expanded 5 for 5 Skills certification program (Flagging/traffic Control **Safety, Scissor Lift Operator Safety, Forklift Operation, OSHA 10-hour certification, and** ServSafe®)
- Culinary training programs
- Constructed **James T. Vaughn Vocational Skills Center** (Delaware Skills Center model opening in 2024)

Probation Reentry Supports

- In Reach Officers in each county conduct reentry planning with inmates before release
- DOC contracts with specialized reentry teams that work with high needs/high risk individuals to secure housing, medication, and medical care, and referral to behavioral health services upon release.
- Probation and Parole contracts with community provider to provide transitional reentry services (case management, transportation to treatment/sober living/housing, overcome immediate reentry challenges and transition to longer term support).
- Improved Probation & Parole experience through hybrid caseloads, comprehensive discharge planning, EPICS, policy changes, and training.




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Probation & Parole Population

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Return to Prison Recidivism Data




- ✓ For the past two years, Delaware has maintained a "Return to Prison" percentage under 10%.

Fiscal Year 2025 Governor's Recommended DOC Budget


Allocation by Category

DOC FTE Position History




