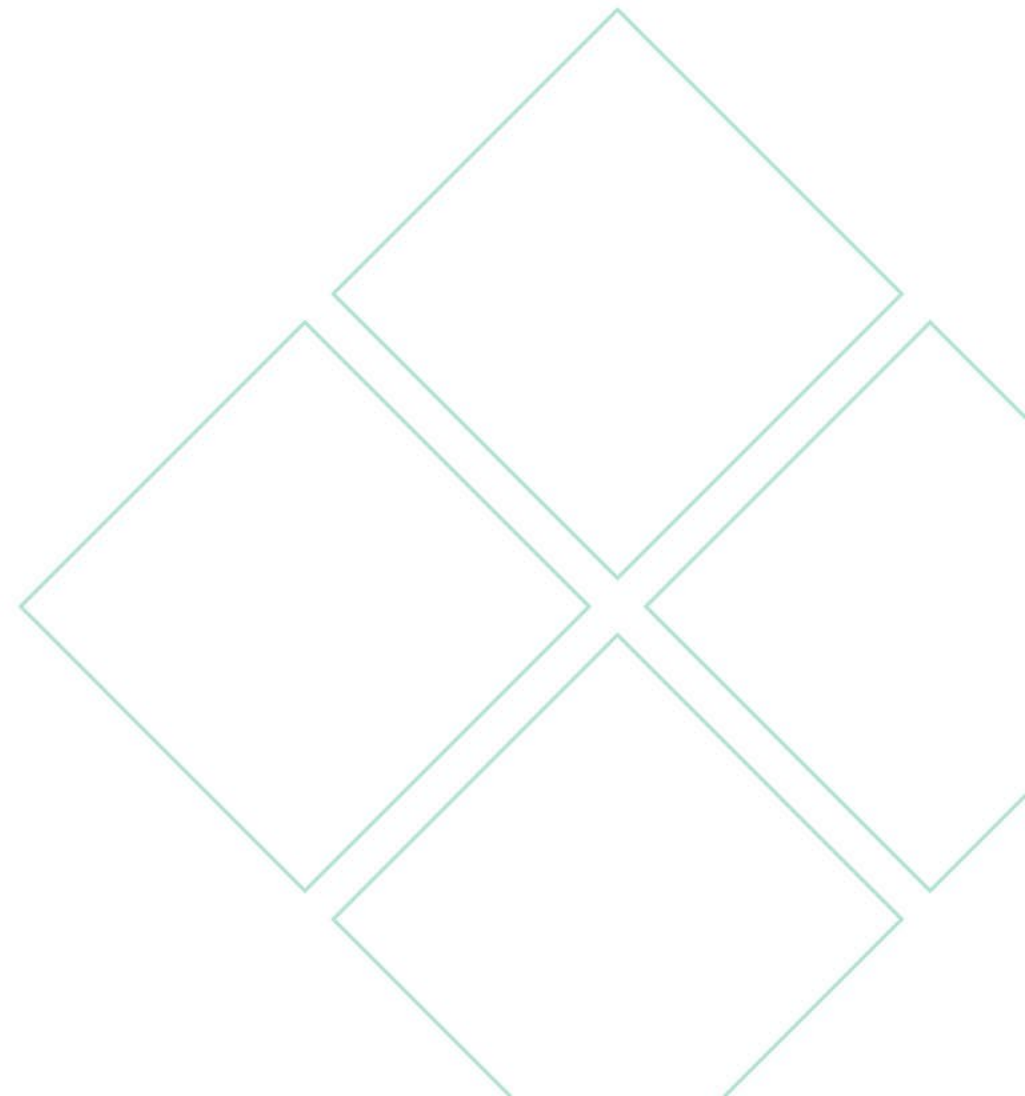


Mission

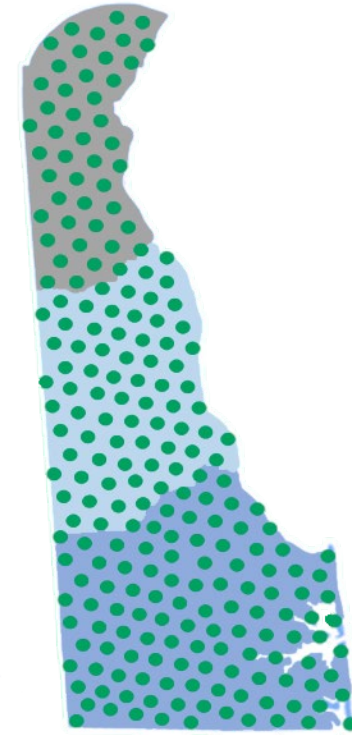
