HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 49

RECOGNIZING THE YOUNG MEN FROM ACROSS THE STATE OF DELAWARE PARTICIPATING IN THE 2019
SESSION OF DELAWARE'S BOYS STATE.

1 WHEREAS, during the week of June 9, 2019, young men from across the State of Delaware, students at the
2 State's public and private high schools, have come to Legislative Hall in Dover to participate in the 2019 session of
3 Delaware Boys State; and
