HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 141st GENERAL ASSEMBLY HOUSE BILL NO. 533

AS AMENDED BY

HOUSE AMENDMENT NO. 1

AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 29, CHAPTER 69 OF THE DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO THE PROVISIONS OF CAPITAL PROJECT COORDINATOR SERVICES TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF DELAWARE:

1	Section 1. Amend Title 29 of the Delaware Code by adding a new Section 6967 as follows:
2	"§ 6967. State Project Coordinator Services Provided on Behalf of School Districts.
3	(a) A school district may request the Department of Administrative Services to provide
4	project coordinator services to manage a capital project on behalf of a school district.
5	(b) Project coordinator services shall be defined as work performed by the Department on
6	behalf of a school district to coordinate the activities of the architect, engineer, project
7	manager, general contractor or multiple prime contractors and other entities as required by
8	a specific capital project to ensure that the project is completed in the best interests of the
9	school district in a timely and fiscally prudent manner. Project coordinator services may
10	include assistance during the pre-bid and bidding process, but in all cases the school
11	district shall have full and final responsibility for approving contract and bid documents
12	and entering into contracts with General Contractors, Multiple Prime Contractors, Project
13	Managers and others to facilitate the completion of a capital or MCI project. The school
14	district shall be responsible for providing all legal counsel and representation, unless
15	otherwise agreed to by the school district and the Secretary. With the agreement of the
16	Secretary, the provision of service may commence at any time during a project.

- 17 (c) Should a school district request that the Department provide project coordinator services, 18 the school district shall submit its request to the Secretary with sufficient time for the 19 Department to determine if the Department can provide such services. The time interval 20 necessary for the Department to designate or contract for the required project 21 coordinator(s) may vary depending on factors related to, but not limited to, the then 22 current labor supply, prior requests for project coordinator services and the number of 23 projects being coordinated by the Department.
 - (d) Project coordinator(s) assigned to a school district project shall be employed by or contracted for by the Department and shall report directly to the Department.
- 26 (e) If the Secretary approves the request of a school district for the Department to provide 27 project coordinator services, the Department and the school district shall enter into a 28 contract that defines the terms and conditions of the Department's provision of these 29 services. The contract shall include, but not be limited to, the description and scope of the 30 project, the role and scope of the project coordinator(s), the number of FTEs assigned to 31 the project, the beginning date and end date of the project, project and financial reporting 32 requirements of the school district, a single point of contact for the school district, 33 procedures for obtaining information and decisions from the school district and dispute 34 resolution procedures. The contract shall also include language that specifies the cost to 35 the school district for the Department's provision of project coordinator services based on 36 the scope of the project and the scope of involvement of the project coordinator(s). The 37 contract shall also provide for a means to adjust the cost to the school district if the term of 38 the project is longer or shorter than the term specified in the agreement. The contract shall 39 be signed by the school district and Secretary of the Department prior to the Department's 40 provision of project coordinator services.
 - (f) The contract between the Department and a school district may be executed contingent on the passage of a school district referendum that will be used to fund capital projects. In the event the referendum does not pass, the contract shall not be binding on either the Department or the school district. If the referendum passes, the school district shall

45 transfer the full amount specified in the contract for project coordinator services to the 46 Department prior to the provision of any service by the Department to the school district. If the contract is executed after the passage of a referendum, funds for the full amount 47 48 specified in the contract for project coordinator services shall be transferred to the 49 Department by the school district within thirty days of the execution of the contract by the 50 Department and school district. If such fund transfer does not take place within the 51 specified thirty days, the Department is under no obligation to provide project coordinator 52 services to the school district.

(g) Project coordinator services provided to a school district by the Department shall not be
funded from the State's share of a capital project but may be funded by any source of funds
allowed by the State's Accounting Manual and/or a portion of the school district's capital
project referendum proceeds. Under no circumstance shall the Department be a party to
the contract(s) between a school district and a general contractor, multiple prime
contractors, project manager or others required to facilitate the completion of a capital or
MCI project.".
